## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

s there ever a dull moment in our wonderful timber industry?

Over the last four hectic years we have experienced a roller coaster ride of takeovers, pricing, profit and loss.

Those in the trade who are older, and possibly wiser, will no doubt argue that they've experienced similar trading conditions in the past, and that some have also been at the extremes.

They're right of course, but on each occasion there have been completely different sets of circumstances in play, with no single dominant factor.

Fundamentally, it comes down to supply and demand – it is always supply and demand! As Adam Smith stated in 1776, "Consumer demand for an item decreases as its price rises. As prices rise, producers manufacture more to gain more profit."

And, of course, a rise in fortunes is invariably followed by a decline. What the industry has been through over the last few years has and continues to be a shock to the system, as well as a strain on resources. Activity levels in both good and poor markets have increased pressure on us all – buyers, sellers, even accountants!

Whatever the reason for change to our business plans, we continue to adopt a flexible and pragmatic approach, it keeps our timber industry fluid and healthy... we cannot be accused of having dull moments!

So why are we writing about trade when this article is an update on the work of the TTBS?

Well, in a sense it is self-evident, the two are inextricably linked.

We should all take a step back and ask ourselves what effect this period has meant for our former timber colleagues, those who were not part of the demand boom. Those who have retired and fallen on hard times, have been made redundant, or have had to drop out of the workforce through ill health or misfortune?

How have they coped with booming inflation in food and energy, higher interest rates, increases in mortgage and rental rates?

The cost of living crisis has undoubtedly impacted us all, but many of us have seen some help in wage inflation and have been able to gear our lifestyles to suit circumstances.

For those who had nothing to start with, those who were already beyond the 'breadline', how have they managed and how are they going to cope in the future?

It should give us all some solace that as part of our great timber industry, we have inherited the Timber Trades' Benevolent Society, inaugurated over 125 years ago with the single aim of helping those in need.

It's our own industry charity, run on a voluntary basis by a small group of trustees, all with long-standing timber trading experience. Nationwide, we rely upon eight regions working on the society's behalf, organising fabulous social events that have now become part of the industry's calendar. Local regions take responsibility for their beneficiaries, regularly visiting and reacting to needs where necessary. The work started all those years ago continues.

Early in 2023, the trustees made the

decision to make a 'one-off' payment to each of our 102 beneficiaries to help during the financial crisis and from the ensuing correspondence, we can report that this gesture was exceptionally well received.

Our overall spend this year will be close to £200,000 and is expected to increase further for 2024.

We continue to help with winter fuel allowances, TV licences, Christmas hampers and incidentals, of which there are many.

And so, the charity moves on; for 2024 you will see changes in communication, changes to the website, simpler ways to make donations and opportunities to become patrons of the society. More importantly, potential beneficiaries will find it easier to apply for grants.

All this takes time, energy and money. We're delighted to be partnering with David Hopkins and Karen Sussex at Timber Development UK (formerly the Timber Trade Federation), both of whom are injecting a great deal of their time and considerable experience into the future of our marketing and national fund-raising.

The energy comes from within the regions and the innovative events that we all attend. However, there's always more that we can do, and we can if more people help us. We need creatives to join local regions and to bring fresh ideas to the table. We need to appeal and be relevant to the staff in the yard as well as those in the office.

Finally, the money. It comes from us all, through donations, legacies, raffle ticket sales and your continued support and attendance at TTBS events. It comes from investments built up over decades, for that we're grateful, every year we spend more than we raise.

Without your help and support, the last few years would have been so much tougher for our beneficiaries. We want to ensure that their futures are as comfortable as possible.

Your support is very much appreciated by them all, and on their behalf, we thank you.
